Young One's Class

(Ms. Gail and Ms. Liz)

- •This is a fairly new class we have opened for young Ones. A child is eligible for this class the day after their first birthday.
- •This classroom introduces the very basics to our little ones. We learn to sit and eat our lunch at the table, sleep on a mat and begin to play with other children.
- •We have stretch and grow daily. We use music and dance for a fun way to get children to

interact with us and each other.

- •Throughout the week there are art activities that correspond with the weekly theme. The children are encouraged to be unique with their art creations, for art can inspire.
- •We have outside time when weather permits.
- •We have morning circle time and afternoon circle time. During this time we introduce songs, stories and nursery rhymes.
- Our children are being introduced to simple sign language. We also have Chapel time once a week, where we sing Bible songs and read a short Bible story in the classroom.
- •This class gives us the opportunity to give one on one attention to these young ones.
- •The Florida ratio for this class is 1:6. Here at St. Christopher's we try not have any more than ten children in the class and have three to four teachers.
